Sequence of Basic Job Steps	Potential Accidents or Hazards	Recommended Safe Job Procedure
Preparing for the dive	Lack of information on conditions Improper gloves and dress causing abrasions and lacerations.	Gather all pertinent information pertaining to work site conditions prior to dive and ensure all involved parties are properly briefed. If in doubt of conditions always prepare for the worse, i.e. zero conditions
Working in zero visibility conditions	Abrasions, lacerations, and punctures to hands and body. Pinch points and crushing injuries during movements of heavy objects. Disorientation and confusion.	Wear thick gloves, Kevlar gloves are preferred but will not adequately protect from puncture wounds. Never wear short sleeves, always ensure 100% protection for you entire body. Lightly probe and feel an object before pushing against or grabbing hold of. During dive briefing crew to be familiar with task at hand, including but not limited to the intended tools to use, work site conditions, vessel heading, and all potential hazards. Before starting work on bottom the diver should first take the necessary time to become familiar with his work site. Make all crane and tigger moves slowly, use tag lines whenever appropriate, Plan an escape route before making moves.
